

- What is the mission of the non-profit/community organization? The mission of Greenwood Recycling is to reduce the amount of waste in our area landfills through education and volunteerism.

The Act 648 implementation guide contains a breakdown of a few subject areas and goals. Students will participate as volunteers and accomplish the goal of reduced waste in area landfills by educating and assisting the local community. They will train those that come to the facility to sort their recyclables.
