Minutes of the Meeting of the Board of Directors

Held in the Belmond-Klemme High School Library 411 Tenth Avenue Northeast, Belmond, Iowa 50421

Thursday, April 15, 2021 – TENTATIVE - UNAPPROVED

The Board of Directors for the Belmond-Klemme Community School District met for a regular board meeting at the above date at 7:03 P.M.

On Friday, March 20, 2020, Governor Reynolds signed a proclamation easing the rules for public meetings during the course of the COVID-19 public health emergency. The requirement that school boards have a physical meeting location where the public can congregate to listen to the meeting was temporarily suspended. During this time period, meetings must be hosted entirely through electronic means.

The meeting was called to order by Board President Rick McDaniel.

President McDaniel asked for the roll to be called. The Board Secretary called the roll. Present for the meeting were Rick McDaniel, Michelle Murphy, Sharon Barkema, Gary Berkland, Marc Schlichting, and Jim Swenson. Ryan Meyer was absent. Also present were Superintendent Dan Frazier, and Board Secretary Thelma Martinez. President McDaniel determined that a quorum was present.

President McDaniel welcomed Zachery Brannen, Shea Sopher and Kaitlin Alfaro who talked about the teacher negotiations.

Superintendent Frazier moved consent item 4(i) Coaching Assignments for Summer 2021 to action item 6(h). President McDaniel asked the board to approve the amended agenda. Moved by Berkland; seconded by Swenson. Motion carried 6/0.

Reports

School Improvement: Jacobson Elementary Mathematics Curriculum Mr. Renwick and Ms. Sudtelgte reported on the Math Program at Jacobson Elementary

Superintendent Frazier presented the graduation rates in the State of Iowa. He also, mentioned the new Owl Meeting Pro to broadcasting the board meeting, commented the opening soccer boys season, and finally, Superintendent Frazier reported to the board on the arrival of the new computers.

Principal Young updated the board on the new hires for the elementary school. He also, mentioned the food pantry still operating once a month, commented about the reading a running program, and the Iowa assessments and FAST testing.

Principal Fisher mentioned the new location of the main office. He also, commented on the soccer, track and golf seasons. Mr. Fisher mentioned the new math interventionist will help also at High School. Finally, Principal Fisher mentioned the clinic with Mr. Kuehner, retired Hampton-Dumont band director.

School Finance: Amendment of fiscal year 2021(Current Year) School District Budget Superintendent Frazier recommended the board move to publish notice of a public hearing and hold a public hearing on and amended budget for the current Fiscal Year at May 20, 2021, school board meeting. Moved by Barkema; seconded by Schlichting and Berkland. Motion carried 6/0.

School Finance: Instructional Support Program

Board voted to review a renewal of the school district's Instructional Support Program. Moved by Swenson; seconded by Murphy. Motion carried 6/0.

Amendment of this Year's School Calendar 2020-2021

Superintendent Frazier recommended the board move to adjust the school calendar for the current year so that the last day of students is Thursday, June 3, and the workday for teachers is Friday, June 4, 2021, conditional upon no further school cancellations for weather or other unforeseen circumstances. Moved by Schlichting; seconded by Barkema. Motion carried 6/0.

First Reading of Revised School Board Policy 803.1 Disposition of Obsolete Equipment Director Berkland moved to approve the First Reading of Revised Policy 803.1 as presented; seconded by Schlichting. Motion carried 6/0.

Disposition of Computer Equipment Resolution of Intent

The president of the Board called up for consideration the Resolution of Intent for the Disposition of Computer Equipment. Director Swenson introduced the following Resolution and moved its adoption. Director Murphy seconded the motion to adopt. The roll was called and the vote was:

The President declared the Resolution adopted as follows:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Belmond-Klemme Board of Directors voted on Thursday, May 18, 2017 to make Belmond-Klemme a one-to-one school by provide a computing device to every student in grades 5 through 12; and,

WHEREAS, the Belmond-Klemme faculty has committed itself to effectively using technology in teaching by adopting the following goal: "We will integrate relevant technologies to support optimal learning"; and,

WHEREAS, our initial computer investment was intended for four years with the intention of replacing all the devices after the four-year period had transpired; and,

WHEREAS, four years has now passed and the district has already invested in new computers to replace the existing computers; and,

WHEREAS, the computers purchased in 2014 retain some value and remain a financial asset to the school district that can be re-sold; and,

WHEREAS, the district has the potential to recover some of the current value of their computers through asset remarketing; and,

WHEREAS, the district lacks the staff to provide on-going technical support for the computers for local sales to individuals; and,

WHEREAS, the district cannot legally transfer or sell the software currently on the computers through local sales to individuals; and,

WHEREAS, our computers retain data that need to be deleted for the protection of the district and the individuals it serves; and,

WHEREAS, the district stands the best opportunity to reclaim the maximum available value for its used computers by selling to a commercial computer buy-back company.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of Directors of the Belmond-Klemme Community School district on this date that Belmond-Klemme will dispose of its old and obsolete computer equipment in accordance with the following:

- 1. The Board of Directors approves the re-sale of approximately 550 Apple MacBook Air laptops purchased by the school district in 2017;
- 2. The Board of Directors approves soliciting bids from commercial computer buy-back companies to reclaim the maximum available value for its used computers;
- 3. The Board of Directors approves selling all computers only to the commercial computer buy-back company the district-selects;
- 4. This Resolution not withstanding Board Policy 803.1 disposition of Equipment, as the volume and complexity of the disposition of this computer equipment has unique challenges and security considerations.
