## What do you need from your teachers more than anything else?

- More realistic sexual education for students (I asked for clarity, they shared what is being taught is really what happens)
- Recognition for every community in our school
- More open access to mental health resources
- Year round cultural appreciation
- Promote racial awareness (Do's and Don'ts)
- Relationship support group/clubs/classes (I asked for clarification, and they described many situations in relationships where they struggle to navigate because they don't know how to respond to conflict or being treated a certain way in a relationship)
