Food Service:

- SY 2025/2026 Full administrative All Programs
 - NSLP-Adult meals are found to be underpriced. We will recommend the board raise Adult meals to \$8.00 for SY 2027
 - NSLP-Updated sheets for Product Formulation Statements
 - NSLP/SBP-All students must grab meals, staff cannot do this for them.
 - ALL-New Justice for All posters with March 2025 updated civil rights statement
 - ALL- Spreadsheet of consolidated claims needs a second signature and confirmation
 - CACFP-Onsite Counts and claims verification for After School- 3rd review needs to be end of April or beginning of May to avoid a 6 month laps since the first must be done after October 1
 - SBP-Product counts prior to service must be double checked after service to ensure all students take minimum requirements- training on this was held January 5th
- Local Procurement
 - SY24 1.4% of food purchased was considered local
 - SY25 11.58% of food purchased was considered local
- Grants:
 - Culinary Arts Grant- collaboration between Culinary classes and food service- Culinary arts classes will get \$3,500 to spend on supplies and goods to create recipes that can be utilized in the food service program
