Exceptional Programs Office	 EPO will be providing all building administrators, special education teachers, and related service staff with IEP Behavior Goal training during the month of January. EPO will be providing targeted training in the second semester to support all staff, including general education teachers and educational assistants, to support students with disabilities in their classrooms. EPO is growing their own Diagnosticians and SLPs. In the last year we have two new district diagnosticians who have completed internships, and this Spring will have an SLP Intern, who can become an SLP-A in the district next school year.

Bobbi Newland - Chief Financial Officer:

• The 40th day student count numbers were certified and sent to PED on 1/3/24. The 40th day count came in at 10895.5 FTE. The FTE numbers are used to calculate our SEG funding. The 10,895.5 student count is below the 22/23 40 day student count of 11,033. If the decrease in FTE continues into the 80th and 120th day student counts that will result in a decrease in the district's SEG funding for next year.
