BACKGROUND:	The scope of this project satisfies and exceeds the legal mandates for silent panic alert technology from the Texas Legislature found in <u>Senate Bill 838</u> and <u>Commissioner's Rules Concerning School Facilities</u> <u>Chapter 61 (c)(10)(B).</u>
	The CENTEGIX Safety Platform is a badge-based incident response solution worn by every staff member that empowers them to get help from school administrators or put the entire campus in a lockdown with the push of a button. This system includes room level location details and audio/visual notifications so that everyone on the campus, district administrators, and Pasadena ISD Police know that a site has been locked down. The platform provides coverage of the entire school grounds, including fields and parking lots. The platform also includes a comprehensive visitor management system and a dynamic digital mapping program that elevates safety management, planning, preparedness, and response.
FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:	The total amount per year is \$652,250 for a total of five years not to exceed \$3,261,250. All services applied for will be covered through a combination of grant funds, general operating funds to include fund balance. This process secures the opportunity to receive additional savings to district for these specific services.
