Identification may be required of any person on school property. The Board or its designee may refuse to allow persons having no legitimate business to enter school property. The Board or its designee may reject any undesirable person from the property upon said person's refusal to leave peaceably on request.

Identification may be required of any person on school property. The Board or its designee may refuse to allow persons having no legitimate business to enter school property. The Board or its designee may reject any undesirable person from the property upon said person's refusal to leave peaceably on request.

Proposed Policy

A private investigator may be allowed on school campus, but they must be authorized by the school administration prior to being on district property to conduct their investigation. School administration may require court orders or parent/empolyee authorization before granting school authorization. School administration may establish procedures for how investigations on campus will be conducted to minimize disruption to the learning environment and respect individuals' rights. Private investigators are subject to the same laws and regulations as any other individual, including those related to trespassing and privacy.
