-A Note from the Principal-

As I write this month's note to our community, I want to remind our patrons that our Winter break will start December 17th, 2016 and we will return January 2nd, 2017 after having two weeks off and away from school. I point this out as an important piece of information concerning student progress and accountability.

Time away from school can be healthy for all involved. This being noted, it is important to say that too much time away can cause a sense of sluggishness upon returning for many of our students. It is my hope that conversations around finishing the semester strong happen over the break so that when our students return from two weeks off, they are ready to hit it hard in finishing the first semester. It seems that some of our students lack a sense of urgency in finishing what they start. Semester grades are extremely important as they are transcripted and this record then becomes something that follows a student for their lifetime.

With having advisory time being scripted in the weekly schedule- it is important to note that students will need to determine who they will present to during the April conference times. This student led conference will be about five minutes in length where a student has the opportunity to share their best work samples and some information concerning the effort they have made during the year. The conference will be presented to an adult or two that has a vested interest in the future of the student. They will be able to share what they have explored in the way of career development and all of reflection around talent search results. It is important for most to involve a parent or two with this. If you are not able to attend, it would be great if you could problem solve with your student as to who might be invited. We really do not want any larger of a group than two adults and the advisor in this conference.

There are lots of activities starting with the winter season upon us... this being said, let's all keep our eye on the goal of staying focused on the academic needs of our students so they are reported accurately at semester end in January.

HV volleyball drops 4A consolation match at state tourney




"We've got a young group of kids, only two seniors, and we competed with everyone," Hidden Valley coach Robert Jackson said. "Most of these girls are freshmen and sophomores, and it's pretty cool to see they can compete with juniors and seniors at this level."

Jackson said the season was a success even though they didn't bring home a trophy. "We're proud of the year we had," Jackson said. "Proud to be 17-4. We're definitely not hanging our heads. We're happy to be up here."

HV boys gain valuable state experience



David Prudell led the Mustangs by taking 41st overall in 17:40. "This is my junior year," Prudell said. "I knew that I had to step it. I was getting pumped up. ... This makes me want it more. I want to get in the top 10 next year." Senior Arin Lowry claimed 62nd (18:22). "Arin finishing second (among his teammates), just an unbelieveable effort," Hidden Valley coach Brian Miller said. "I'm really proud of him." Zach Ellison (90th place, 18:53), Cody

Lomica (91st, 18:55) and Josh Rabjohn (108th 19:49) also scored for the Mustangs.

"They all ran well," said Miller, who also is the school's athletic director. "We have everybody back except Arin. This team, with a full year of training could be a top three-four team next year."
