I have been thinking a lot since the meeting Tuesday evening 5/15 and I would like to share a few ideas with you.

Many had suggested fund raisers to put money back into the budget. And I say why not? Our band holds fundraisers the students hold fundraisers for various activities. Why can't we as a community hold a fundraiser to raise money to keep our citizens employed? This is more than about our schools it's about Clio as a community. And I see that there are ways to keep our community functioning and to keep these jobs here. And we all know that Michigan is suffering as a State and as a community we can save our own little part of Michigan by holding fundraisers to keep the school employees employed so they can continue to give back to our community.

- 1. We have a lot of local talent in Clio not only with our students but many adults in the Clio area are also involved in bands and other forms of entertainment.
