All of the parents and/or guardians of the American Indian students in our district were contacted and invited to participate in an Al parent committee meeting. We contacted the parents by email and through our parent portal, and for those without email addresses, we sent a letter via US mail. We also advertised the meeting on our school webpage. We held the meeting at 5pm on Tuesday, January 23rd, 2018 at the District Office. Unfortunately we did not have any parents attend and, therefore, we do not currently have a Al parent advisory committee.

Two AI parents/guardians did contact us with interest in AI programming at BHM schools, but they did not want to be a part of a committee at this time. One parent showed interest in attending the meeting, but she emailed the night of the meeting stating that she was unable to attend. We followed up with that parent the following day to let her know that we will contact her as we schedule future meetings in an attempt to establish an AI parent committee. We also told her that we would welcome any thoughts or input that she has in the meantime. We did not receive a reply back.

We attended the AIPAC training session hosted by MDE in Sartell MN on December 12th, 2017. Since that session we have reviewed the information given to us in order to find ways to establish an active AIPAC. We will continue to brainstorm ideas as we work towards implementing an active AIPAC.
