
#### 2nd grade ISIP by actual student numbers

2nd grade Student tier 1,2,3 movement



From September to November 2nd grade moved 3 students to tier 1 benchmark. In September there were 31 students performing at tier 1 benchmark. In November there are now 34 students performing at tier 1 benchmark. From September to November 2nd grade moved 7 students out of tier 3 intensive. In September there were 73 students performing at tier 3 Intensive. In November there are 66 students performing at tier 3 intensive.

From September to November tier 1 Benchmark increased by 2%, tier 2 Strategic increased by 3% and tier 3 intensive decreased by 6%.



2nd Grade - November 2019



The Overall Reading ISIP score for the month of **November** in 2nd grade is 26% (34 out of 130) students performing at benchmark or categorized as tier 1. There are 23% (30 students) performing at strategic or categorized as tier 2. There are 51% (66) students performing at tier 3.

The greatest subskill is vocabulary with 32%(42) students performing at benchmark or categorized as tier 1. There are 39% (51) students performing or categorized as tier 3. The skill that needs growth or improvement is spelling. In Spelling there are 27%(35) students performing at benchmark or categorized as tier 1. There are 49% (64) students performing or categorized as tier 3. In Comprehension, there are 28% (36) students performing at benchmark or categorized as tier 1. There are 58%( 76) students performing or categorized as tier 3.

In reading our 3rd grade goal is to increase tier 1 benchmark by 15% and decrease tier 3 intensive by 15%.



From September to November 3rd grade moved 8 students to tier 1 benchmark. In September there were 35 students performing at tier 1 benchmark. In November there are now 43 students performing at benchmark. From September to November 3rd grade moved 4 students out of tier 3 intensive. In September there were 69 students performing at tier 3 Intensive. In November there are now 65 students performing at tier 3 intensive.


#### 3rd grade OVER ALL READING SCORES

From September to November tier 1 Benchmark increased by 5%, Tier 2 Strategic decreased by 2% and Tier 3 intensive decreased by 3%.

The Overall Reading ISIP score for the month of **November** in 3rd grade is 29% (43 out of 149) students performing at benchmark or categorized as tier 1. There are 28% (41 students) performing at strategic or categorized as tier 2. There are 44% (65) students performing at tier 3.

The greatest subskill is vocabulary with 38%(57) students performing at benchmark or categorized as tier 1. There are 39% (58) students performing or categorized as tier 3. The skill that needs growth or improvement is spelling. In Spelling there are 25%(37) students performing at benchmark or categorized as tier 1. There are 47% (70) students performing or categorized as tier 3. In comprehension there are 32% (47) students performing at benchmark or categorized as tier 3.


In reading our 3rd grade goal is to increase tier 1 benchmark by 15% and decrease tier 3 intensive by 15%.

## STAR Math

#### **Second Grade Math**

Our goal for Mathematics is to increase Tier 1 (Green) by 15% and decrease Tier 3 (Yellow and red) by 15%.

Since the Fall benchmark test in September, 2nd grade has increased their Tier 1 group by 2% and decreased their Tier 3 by 8%. There was only a small difference in the number of students tested in September as opposed to November showing only two more students who tested.

Second grade has recently started to focus on standards based instruction and has been working on unwrapping the math standards to improve instruction and to increase their assessment data in math. The second grade teachers, instructional coaches, and principal and vice principal plan to continue working together in anticipation of increasing the tier 1 group and decreasing tier 3 throughout the school year.

#### **Third Grade Math**

Our goal for Mathematics is to increase Tier 1 (Green) by 15% and decrease Tier 3 (Yellow and red) by 15%.

Third has increased their tier 1 students from the benchmark test in September to the most recent test in November. Tier 1 went up from 8% to 14% which is a 6% increase. Their tier 3 decreased from 73% to 69% totaling a 4%. The number of students tested between September and November was nearly the same, 144 to 145 although in December only 132 students completed the STAR Math assessment.

The third grade math team has started to deliver standards based instruction and progress monitoring in their classrooms. As a grade level, they have started this type of instruction since the beginning of November. We are anticipating an increase in our tier 1 students and a decrease in the tier 3 group in relation to the standards based instruction.

#### **Veterans Day**

For Veterans Day November 11th, we invited Veterans to come to the school and eat lunch with the students. The cafeteria was decorated with a Veterans wall of pictures and the tables were decorated. The event was organized by Frances Kittson, Angela Marceau, Sasheen Campbell, Mary Belcourt, Shanell Bird Rattler, BES cooks and students.




### Night of the arts
