Nominations for Denton Central Appraisal District Board of Directors Report

Board Goal: VI. Growth, Change & Fiscal Responsibility...

Purpose of Report

The Denton Central Appraisal District (DCAD) has requested its taxing jurisdictions to nominate by Resolution up to five people to be considered for their Board of Directors. The Resolution must include the name and address of each candidate nominated. To be eligible to serve on the board, an individual must be a resident of the district (Denton County) and must have resided in the district for at least two years immediately preceding the date they take office. According to Section 6.03 of the Property Tax Code, it is the chief appraiser's responsibility to initiate this process. The chief appraiser does not have the authority, or duty to investigate, or judge, the qualifications of the nominees.

TERM OF OFFICE – Section 5.13(d) of SB2 Second Special Session 88th Legislature redefined the terms for appointed positions on the appraisal district board of directors. For the term of office beginning on January 1, 2025, officers will serve either a one or a three-year term. All terms thereafter will be 4-year staggered terms. Term length each appointed position will be determined by drawing during the first calendar meeting of 2025.

The nominations must be returned to the Denton Appraisal District by October 15, 2024.

An individual that is serving on the governing body of a city, county, or school district is eligible to serve as an appraisal district's director. Currently, Charles Stafford is the District's representative. There is a total of 5000 votes combined for all of the jurisdictions which will equal 833 votes for a candidate to be confirmed.
