IMPLEMENTATION SECOND SEMESTER

- Adjustments made second semester in grading practices:
 - +Adjusted weighted categories when calculating grade
 - +Standardized the reassessment time frame to 10 days
 - +Relearning and reassessment provided on all major summative assessments
 - +Relearning and reassessment on minor summative assessments determined by the teacher
 - +Increased communication and feedback for students and parents

IMPLEMENTATION SECOND SEMESTER

×Support for teachers

- +Middle school teachers met and shared best practices and successes in implementing the new grading and assessment guidelines with a focus on using technology.
- +High school teachers worked on assessment and grading as a department on their campus.
- +Academic Leadership Teams focused on supporting teachers in standard referencing each assessment and grade entry.
- +Secondary Curriculum Coordinators have been working with teachers on developing assessments, reassessments, and feedback strategies as part of curriculum refinement.

 - +strengthen the relationship between homework/practice, formative assessment, and student learning.
 - +provide a structure for increased collaboration among teachers (PLCs).
 - +continue the efforts to provide weekly communication with parents.
 - +support teachers with strategies on how to work with students who don't meet deadlines, aren't prepared, and lack self-motivation

NEXT STEPS....

+Professional learning for teachers will continue to focus on supporting the use of formative assessment, providing quality and timely feedback, and reassessing strategies.
