Regular Board of Education Meeting December 8, 2025 – 6:00 p.m.

1. Call to Order

President Burns called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. on December 8, 2025, at 1300 S. 109th Street, West Allis.

6. Walker Elementary School Student Showcase

Walker Elementary School Principal Miller briefly reviewed the District's Theory of Action and how it connects to the learning that the students will be sharing. 7. Superintendent's Report

7.1 Legislative Updates:

Initial SPED prorated reimbursement rate 35%; significantly lower than 42% budget estimate:

DPI has established a Special Education prorated aid rate of 35% for the November 17, 2025 payment, lower than the estimated 42%. This interim rate, applied to avoid overpayments, will be adjusted in June 2026 to reflect each Local Education Agency's (LEA) full eligibility. The state budget sets aid based on approximations prior to official data submission, while actual rates are determined after all financial data from LEAs and other entities is reported. Overpayments can occur if claims exceed the fixed state funding, necessitating prorated distributions.

The committee discussed piloting a partnership with UW–Milwaukee in the 2026-27 school to offer English 101 at both Hale and Central, allowing seniors to earn dual high school and college credit through the same curriculum and expectations used at UW–Milwaukee. West Allis-West Milwaukee would cover the substantially discounted tuition by using qualified current staff to teach the course, providing students expanded post-secondary opportunities at minimal cost.
