By the numbers -

We have 155 students enrolled at Blue Ridge High School. Average Daily Attendance Rate for the month of April was 92.2%.

- So many options for classes and activities for our kids. Overall we have a "can do" attitude in trying to solve problems.

 was awarded the Justin Gale Memorial Hustle and Hard Work Award and Josh was
 selected as the BACC EMT Student of the Year.
- Congratulations to the 2025 Prom King Joey Cole and Prom Queen Ellie Schlieper who were crowned at Promenade on May 3rd.
- Congratulations to the Blue Ridge FFA Chapter. Each year, the members and officer team complete the National Chapter Award application that identifies 15 different activities in 3 different areas that promote Growing Leaders, Strengthening Agriculture, and Building Communities. Chapters are scored on their application which in turn determines their rank and placing not only in the Section but in the state. This year Blue Ridge was named the Section 16 winner in Growing Leaders, Strengthening Agriculture, and Building Communities. Blue Ridge FFA was also named the Section 16 Premier Chapter and a finalist as a top 10% chapter, being one of 36 Illinois FFA Chapters to represent Illinois at Nationals this fall.
