Estacada Middle School Lighting Project

The Estacada Middle School lighting project has been completed. We upgraded from 1,000-watt halogen fixtures to 300-watt LED lighting. This change significantly improves visibility and safety while increasing energy efficiency.

High School Office Update

We are meeting with our plan designer on March 12 to finalize the layout for the ADA-compliant restrooms. This will allow us to move forward with the project.

Athletic Fields

All ball fields have been sprayed for weeds a second time as we prepare for the spring sports season.

Roof Inspections

We completed all district roof inspections this month. One roof leak was identified at EHS. We have signed a contract with LEM Roofing to complete the necessary repairs.

PACE Inspection

I conducted walkthroughs at Clackamas River Elementary and DCLA campus as part of our PACE inspection process. Both locations received high ratings. The only recommendation was to adjust some window coverings to improve line-of-sight visibility.

High School Gym Update

Two new backboard shot clock light systems have been installed in the high school main gym.



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Technology Department



✓ 3 Wins:

- Stadium main gates now have card readers installed, eliminating physical key access. This change helps protect the field while ensuring access is limited to authorized credentials.
- Weekly Security Shout Outs are having measurable impact; during a recent targeted phishing event sent to 45 staff members, all 45 recipients correctly ignored the phishing email, resulting in a 0% interaction rate.
- Instructional disruption from technology issues remained well below the green target, with the department achieving 4% in Q3 against a goal of 8%.

🧠 2 Things Learned:

- Student web traffic for the month of February.



- Pacific Office Automation response times have declined. Historically, POA was very prompt with toner delivery and repairs. Recently, toner and service response has taken significantly longer, which creates avoidable downtime.

🎯 1 Focus:

Streamline copier/toner workflow and improve POA service outcomes. Technology is working to reduce copier downtime and manual back-and-forth by:

- Copiers will be configured to automatically request toner based on device reporting when supplies run low.
- Partnering with POA to improve service responsiveness across schools and offices (clearer escalation, faster turnaround, and fewer repeat interruptions)


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Nutrition Services Department


3 Wins
