# Oregon Shakespeare Festival @

# **LSMS**

After studying Shakespeare's life, his works, his theaters (the Rose and the Globe), Elizabethan England, acting, stage movement, vocal expression, and Costume design throughout the year, Mrs. Taylor's Advanced Language Arts Class and Ms. Parsons' Advanced Social Studies Class took a Backstage Tour at the Oregon Shakespeare Festival in Ashland on Tuesday, April 19. Students were able to tour the Angus Bowmer Theater, the New Theater, and the Elizabethan Theater. They also viewed the set construction crew prepare stages for The Pirates of Penzance and Osase County.

On Wednesday, March 30, students attended a lavish performance of The Imaginary Invalid by French playwright, Moliere. Students had studied 17<sup>th</sup> Century French society, King Louis XIV, French farce/comedy, Italian commedia dell'Arte, the life of Monsieur Moliere, and his opinion/satire of the medical profession. This "musical" version was set in Paris during the 1960s. Our students conducted themselves very well during the discussion with the actors after the play. They asked many thought-provoking questions. We were quite pleased with their attentiveness.

After extensive history, movement, language, and vocal study of Shakespeare's **Julius Caesar**, students attended a modern performance of it on April 19. Their final debriefing with the *Oregon Shakespeare Festival's* educational staff

was afterwards. Our discussion leader was the actress who portrayed Portia (Gina Daniels). She asked questions about how this contemporary "vision" of assassination and power compared to Shakespeare's traditional Elizabethan version or one set in lavish Ancient Rome. Our students performed "brilliantly during this oral exam" by responding with in-depth answers, observations, and opinions. Bravo!
