Volunteer of the month

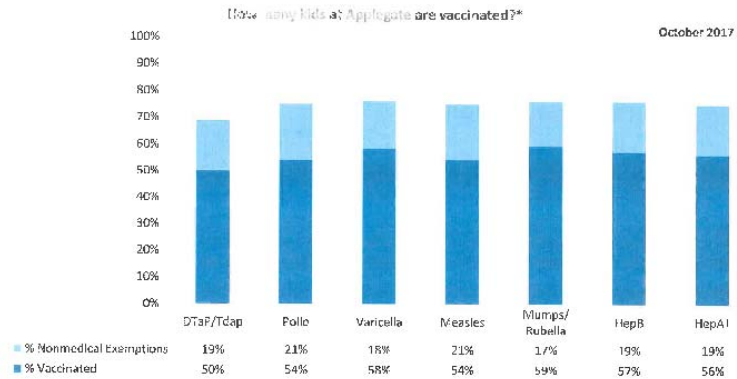

Percent of children with no immunization or exemption record: 24%

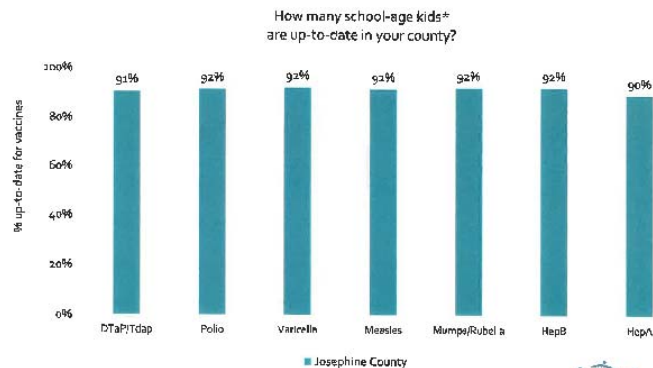
Percent of children with a medical exemption for one or more vaccine(s): 2%
