# **Kindergarten**

October was a fun and busy month for Kindergarten! Our favorite activity of the month was definitely "Who Took the Pumpkin?" Each class had their own pumpkin in their room, but after lunch, each of the pumpkins disappeared! Each day that week, students were given clues to figure out who might have taken the pumpkin and where the pumpkin was hidden. At the end of the week, the "pumpkin taker" was revealed and we celebrated getting our pumpkin back with pumpkin treats! This was an exciting week-long activity that incorporated math, science, reading, and lots of writing. On Halloween each class had the chance to discuss pumpkin parts, carve their pumpkin, and feel the insides. The Kinder students learned so much from these hands-on and engaging activities.

# First Grade

Students have been busy working during October! In math, they have learned to order and compare numbers. In language arts, we read nonfiction books and talked about the main idea, characters, and plot. Students also got to make S'mores by following processing steps and writing a How-To paper. We are looking forward to learning addition and subtraction strategies in math. We will also begin learning about different types of sentences in language arts.

# Second Grade

In second grade we were able to take our community field trip and visit many places in town. We also learned a lot celebrating Red Ribbon Week! We all have made the choice to stay drug free so we can focus on our futures! This month in reading, we will compare and contrast different versions of the same story in traditional folklore, as well as study the structure and elements of poetry. In vocabulary we are using context clues to understand the meaning of a word in a text and in conventions we are reviewing all different kinds of nouns (common/proper, singular/plural). In math, we will be focusing on two digit addition and subtraction with and without regrouping. In science, we will be studying force of motion and different types of energy. In social studies, we will be working with maps, globes, and landmarks of significance.

### Computer:

In November we will be diligently working on our compass math and lexia reading programs. These are both great resources for improving each student's skills and understanding. We will also begin an internet safety program on 3 different subjects 1) appropriate online behavior, 2) safety and privacy, and 3) cyberbullying. ### Art:

Our talented children have been creating artwork that will be previewed to parents in a personalized catalog going home in November. Parents are able to order these keepsakes that have been completed by their children.

### **Music:**

Music classes in November will be studying the King of the Symphony, Joseph Haydn. Kindergarten and First Grade will continue to learn about different classroom

instruments: names, sounds they make, and how to play them. They will continue to sing and dance to music! Second Grade will learn the choreography and memorize their Musical pieces.

## PE:

Our students are excited as we will be introducing basketball as one of our new activities. Students will work on dribbling, shooting, and passing! The classes are so excited. We will talk about different types of passes such as: bounce, chest, and overhead.
