#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

This presentation will provide an overview of the state accountability data for campuses who were issued the Effective Schools Framework (ESF) 2024-2026 grant and also campuses identified as Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI), for the 2025-2026 school year, and the corresponding Targeted Improvement Plans (TIPs).

To identify schools for CSI, TEA annually ranks all Title I campuses based on Closing the Gaps scaled scores. First, TEA determines the bottom five percent of Closing the Gaps outcomes by rank ordering the scaled scores of Title I campuses by school type—elementary, middle, high school/ K–12, and alternative education accountability. TEA then determines which campuses fell in the bottom five percent for each school type. Title I campuses that rank in their school type's bottom five percent are identified for CSI. Additionally, campuses who earn a rating of D for three consecutive years must create and implement a TIP.

Texas Education Agency requires the Board of Trustees to approve the Targeted Improvement Plans if the district or campus is identified as CSI.

#### **All plans are required to include:**

1. Student Outcome Goals
2. Statement of Strategy
3. Curriculum and Instruction Improvements
4. Stakeholder Engagement
5. Performance Management and Milestone
6. Board Approval

#### **ADMINISTRATIVE RECOMMENDATION**
