<u>**Results</u>** Comprehensive school counseling programs are integral to student achievement. Continuous self-evaluation and the collection of data are critical in continuing Denton ISD's counseling department in a forward direction. Additionally, counselor advocacy is equally important in the sustained growth in a successful direction of our counseling programs. The American School Counselor Association (ASCA) has developed a national model which Denton ISD counselors follow. The ASCA model recommends counselors spend a minimum of 80% of their time in direct (individual planning, school counseling curriculum, responsive services) and indirect services (referrals, consultation, collaboration) for students. Because of the support of the Board of Trustees and Central Administration, counselors in Denton ISD are moving ever closer to this goal.</u>
