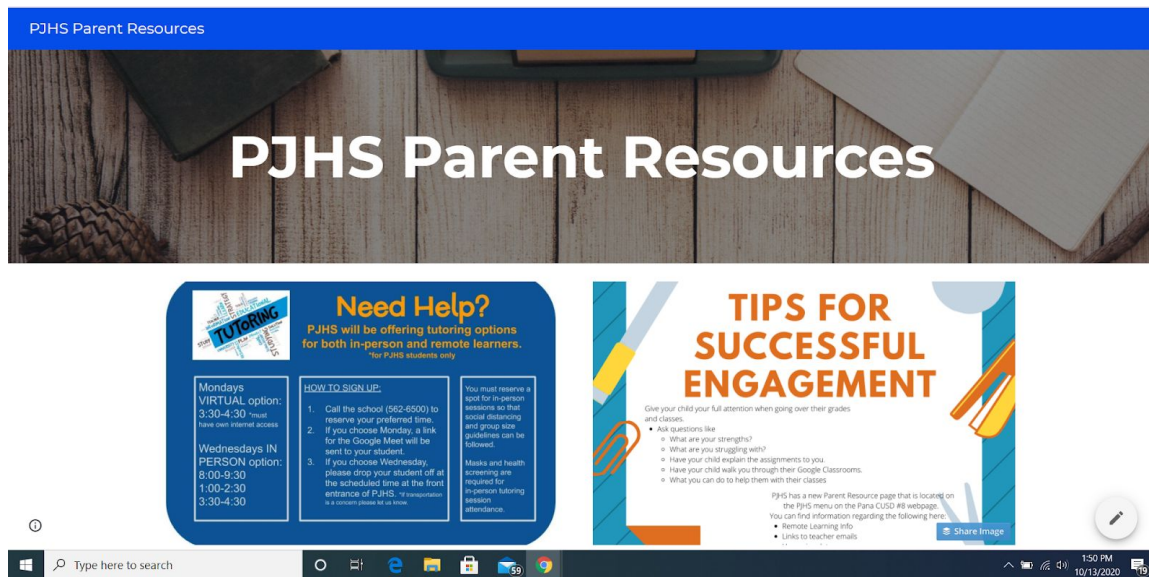
Enrollment as of 10/13/2020:

**Attendance may be trending high because of the remote learning educational option, but engagement may paint a different picture.

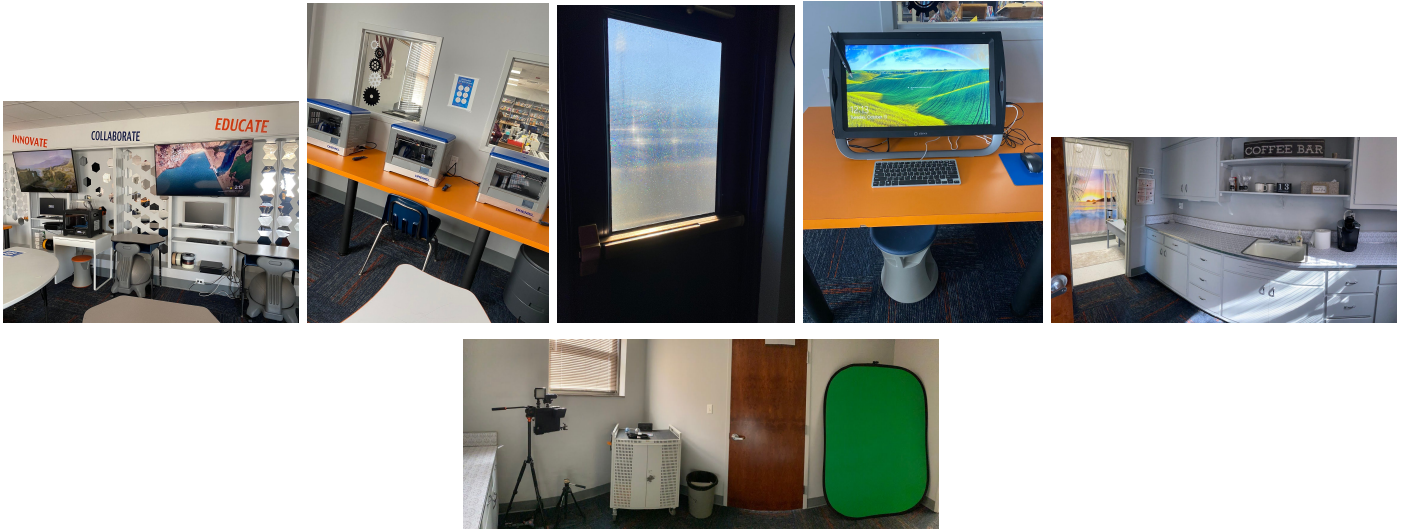
