Wrestling, Girls Basketball, Boys Basketball, Weather, and COVID19

This Winter Sport Season has been roller coaster this year. Wrestling has had no issues with the virus but our weather has made a mark on key match ups with wrestling, meaning, a few schools did not want to chance bringing their wrestlers to this side of the mountains.

Girls Basketball had to reschedule a conference game which was made up the last week of this regular season. As of now the Lady Indians are sitting 4th in the conference standings. Columbia Falls 1, Whitefish 2, Ronan 3, Browning 4, Polson 5, and Libby 6th going into the last week of the regular season, but, this may change at the end of the weekend.
