The following is a summary of the highlights for the Campus Improvement Plan for the 2017-2018 school year:

- State and federal system safeguards are leading the planning and implementation modules for increased student and staff growth to close achievement gaps.
- Enhance learning for all students through the use of technology in the classroom by continuing a 1:1 initiative. All digital initiatives will enhance the identified focus areas in our comprehensive needs assessment, as well as 21st century skills.
- Core values will be taught, instilled, and recognized in all staff and students. These core values
 will be developed for success in their everyday lives in preparing them for their individual
 pathway.
- Partner with Common Sense Media to provide Digital Citizenship education to promote safety
 while harnessing the learning potential of digital media in a 24/7 connected world and achieve
 designation as a Common Sense Media Certified Digital Citizenship School (campus based) and
 District.
- Provide daily face-to-face support to capitalize on research-based practices, embedding and integrating effective technology with sound pedagogy by utilizing the Digital Learning Team.
- Partner with IBM Watson to leverage content, curriculum, and resources to build personalized student profiles to individualize and enhance the learning experience.
- Students will take ownership of their learning by charting and monitoring their progress through data folders. Content lessons will be designed around the specific needs of the students based on this data.
- Content teams are meeting on a weekly basis to plan, discuss, and collaborate. These teams complete a "Roadmap" that everyone contributes to align the focus.
- Data days are scheduled every six week to address areas of strength and weakness. The content teams from both third and fourth will meet together to also strengthen vertical alignment.
- Math across most demographics appears to be a strength at Hook.
- A Distinction Designation was awarded for Post-Secondary Readiness with 55% of our students meeting grade level.
- Hook Culture Implementing the "Move the Bus" idea of working towards a common goal. The "bus" is the achievement of the students and the goal is to push all kids forward to the next level.
- Hook Culture The four G's: Grace, Gratitude, Growth, Grit,
- The state indicator of "Student Progress" increased a measure of 6%. Also, the accountability index measure of "Post-Secondary STAAR Results" increased 5% points.
- Scores were above state averages in all tested areas.

Implement Reading Enrichment class in addition to Read 180 class to meet the needs of ELL and SpEd students based on student data. Previously, ELL students were placed in Read 180 to meet the requirement of being with an ESL certified teacher. This year, teaching assignments were adjusted to include an ESL certified teacher in ELA in 7th and 8th grades.

Implement Texas Future Problem Solving to meet the needs of Gifted and Talented students in reading and writing

Implement strategies to improvement student engagement in the classroom to improve scores in ELL and SpEd subgroups. Strategies include visual representations of vocabulary, sentence stems, and Kagan Cooperative Learning Strategies.

Improve attendance rating by providing positive rewards every 3 weeks (popcorn, homework passes, free gym time, etc). We will also identify students with a history of attendance issues and implement attendance contracts between the student, parent and school.

Adjust master schedule to provide reading all year long for 7th grade students.

Utilize the library to implement STEM activities using Makerspace.
