Goal 1 The percentage of graduates who will qualify for community college/university, military, or industry certification will increase from 62% to 85% for graduating class of 2022.

Student Outcome Progress Measures

Goal 1 Progress Measures

The percentage of graduates who will qualify for community college/university, military, or industry certification will increase from 62% to 85% for graduating class of 2022.

- 1.1: Graduation rate will increase from 88% to 90% by 2018.
- 1.2: Enrollment in dual credit courses will increase by 10% and Industry certifications will increase by 10% in 2018.
- 1.3: The percentage of graduates who will qualify for community college/university, military, or industry certification will increase 4.4% from 62% to 66.4% by 2018.

Goal 2 Progress Measures

 The percent of students who perform at the Masters Grade Level standard for all grades in state mathematics exams will increase from 8% to 40% by 2022.

- 2.1: The percent of elementary students who perform at Masters Grade Level standard for math will increase 3.4% from 11% to 14.4% by 2018.
- 2.2 The percent of middle school students who perform at Masters Grade Level standard for math will increase 1.5% from 4% to 5.5% by 2018.
- 2.3 The percent of high school students who perform at Masters Grade Level standard for math will increase 1.5% from 4% to 5.5% by 2018.

Goal 3 Progress Measures

 The percent of students who perform at the Masters Grade Level standard for all grades in state reading exams will increase from 9% to 40% by 2022.

- 3.1: The percent of elementary students who perform at Masters Grade Level standard for reading will increase 4.5% from 15% to 19.5% by 2018.
- 3.2 :The percent of middle school students who perform at Masters Grade Level standard for reading will increase 3% from 10% to 13% by 2018.
- 3.3:The percent of high school students who perform at Masters Grade Level standard for reading will increase 1% from 2% to 3% by 2018.

The Superintendent will not allow the absence rate to increase or remain the same.

- 1.1: The student absence rate will not exceed 6% in 2017-2018.
- 1.2: The teacher absence rate will not exceed 6% in 2017-2018.

The Superintendent will not allow any campuses to have inequitable access to effective staff.

- 2.1: Counselors will increase their time directly interacting with students by 20% in 2017-2018.
- 2.2: School site-based funding (decentralized budget) will be piloted in 2018-2019 and fully implemented by all campuses in 2019-2020.
- 2.3: Administration will develop a clear and defined improvement plan detailing explicit support measures for teachers who need additional assistance by 2017-2018.

The Superintendent will not propose a change of use for a functioning campus unless the board has adopted a long-term facilities plan that is developed by a structured process for gathering and incorporating the community's values and ideas.

- 3.1 The superintendent will monitor enrollment and increase "academic choice program" options to all middle school students by Spring 2018.
- 3.2 The superintendent will engage a committee of community members before a long-term facilities plan is presented to the board.
