Indicators include MDH and MDE guidance, staffing, student attendance, devices and technology, health and safety, and school services.

Leadership Team reviews indicators, evaluates current model operations and feedback, and makes model change recommendation.

The Incident Command Team provides feedback to Leadership Team and School Board.

The Superintendent will present a learning model plan change recommendation to the Mahtomedi School Board.

The School Board adopts a new learning model.

Transitional days take place in order to plan for new learning model instruction and operational changes.

New learning model is implemented.
Learning model operations feedback tools continue and indicators are observed.




Indicators We Continue to Monitor

- State Guidance: Updates to Minnesota's 2020-21 Safe Learning Plan.
- County COVID-19 Data: the County numbers continue to inform learning model decisions for school districts as an indicator of risk and of predicted staffing impact.
- Mahtomedi district and school COVID-19
 Data: district and school positive case and quarantine data is collected and reviewed weekly. District information is reported weekly in our COVID-19 Dashboard.

Students at Mahtomedi Public Schools are in the 100% In-Person learning model at our elementary and secondary schools.

At this time, we use a district dashboard in order to prevent the identification of specific students and staff.

COVID-19 Protocols

Quarantines

We continue to collect COVID-19 positive case information and notify families regarding close contact and exposure. We use the 14-day quarantine period for staff and students.

Events & Gatherings

- No large in-school gatherings like assemblies.
- The Class of 2021 graduation ceremony will be held outdoors at the Mahtomedi High School Stadium with limited capacity on June 12, 2021. The event will be live-streamed.

- Organizing and reconfiguring classrooms
- Placement of desks (measuring student distance and teacher to student distance)
- Developed school protocols and practices to ensure safety around school (i.e. staggering times in the hallways, using stairways and lockers).

Instruction

- Developed learning plans that will meet the needs of having more kids in classroom as well as designing how to best reach the students who are family choice distance learners and those quarantined.
- Adjusting and planning curriculum from 85minute blocks to 45-minute periods (timing of lessons, giving feedback, and homework)

Family Choice Distance Learning

As we made the switch to in-person learning, we gave families an opportunity to make learning model changes from family choice distance learning to in-person or in-person to family choice distance learning.

Impact of In-Person Learning Groups During Distance Learning

- During distance learning, Mahtomedi Public Schools provided in-person learning for high needs special education students, Special Education, English Language, students with a 504, students requiring academic or social/emotional intervention, students with a "D" or an "F", students at-risk of not graduating, and students experiencing homelessness.
- Students at Mahtomedi Public Schools also had virtual supports available for both elementary and secondary students that included small group academic and social-emotional support.
- Each week we had over 200 students district-wide who attended in-person supports during distance learning. This support has meant that our most at-risk students received academic support and consistency and that our special education students maintained their schedule consistency and connection in a supportive learning environment.

Special Education Impact: By maintaining consistency for our special education students, the transition to in-person has been smooth because our highest needs students have had little impact on their schedule.

Secondary Impact: Secondary teachers are reporting that a significant advantage to bringing in the inperson learning groups during Distance Learning was the opportunity to give individualized attention and it was an opportunity to build relationships which has helped throughout the learning model transitions.
