## **Special Education Activities**

 February 15-19, I attended the National Elementary and Secondary Act or NESEA Convention in New Orleans. It was a fabulous convention with the theme of Reconnect, Renew and Reignite, focusing on bringing educators, students and families back together after the fallout of the COVID-19 Pandemic. A main topic focus was about emotional and mental health of our classroom teachers and building leaders, and how we need to guide with compassion over compliance during this time of reunification. Ne session that I was so lucky to attend, by nationally acclaimed speaker Tara Brown, The Connection Coach, Feelings and Emotions: They aren't Soft Skills...but Hard Science talked in depth about the emotional and psychological toll teaching through the pandemic in a remote format, and that we as an educational community will not be aware of the total emotional cost to our educators and learners for some time. So right now, as re reunite and come together we need to keep in mind that we cannot get to Blooms without Maslow, meaning to achieve higher levels of thinking and academic success. we need to continue focusing on making sure basic needs are met, something this district does and does very well! If we want to continue to increase motivation and engagement, we need to keep encouraging and supporting emotional safety.
