## Science of Reading

This year we have revamped our system to align tier one instruction to the science of reading through explicit and systematic instruction. In March, teachers focused on using their data to drive their instruction for determining what foundational skills were not mastered. Based on the data, teachers strategically implemented skill based grouping for small group instruction. Teachers were provided professional development, time and coaching support for making data based decisions.

## Writing Focus

In March, staff received additional professional development on Project Success Writing by Colleen Wilson. The professional development focused on how to build vocabulary development and sentence structure through character description. Colleen Wilson showed the staff how to use a story from the Wonders curriculum and how to use a graphic organizer for a character description. In addition she showed how to extend it to paragraph writing.

#### Student and staff wellness

For the month of March staff participated in the "Stepping Into Spring Fit Challenge". Staff who wanted to participate tracked their walking steps each day to promote wellness.

- Steps were calculated Monday through Friday from 8 am to 8 pm.
- 2. Teachers enter their own scores on the Google Doc sheet.
- Incentives given to the top three steppers at the end of the month.

Calvin Lang who is the BES wellness coach worked with the district wellness committee to plan the event which is district wide.

For the month of March, BES staff were treated to a potato bar with lots of potato trimmings on St. Patrick's day.

## Instructional Coaching by Arlene Wippert

The month of March began with follow up implementation for SIPPS. The presenter asked if teachers had questions about the program. The structure and routines were discussed and how to navigate the site for teacher resources.

IC Kim Penn, came to help analyze data for Nonsense Word Fluency, Oral Reading Fluency, and 95% Group instruction. Analyzing the data at extended day allowed teachers to target instruction at small groups for students who needed reteaching of phonic skills. The teachers also checked out manipulatives (letters, phonics word building kit, etc.) to support instruction for those students at the concrete level. Specific plans were made for targeted instruction with a second grade class in which the IC and coach modeled teacher table, partner, and independent stations.

Next, with 95% Group support, Tanya Newton came to continue implementation of 95% Phonics. She met with teachers at their grade level to discuss the explicitness of the routine, fidelity to the script, and anchor charts that support students learning the phonic skill routines. She also modeled for a 2nd and 3rd grade teacher and debriefed the lesson with each teacher.

Jennifer Darlington, our instruction coach gave continued PD for Nonsense Word Fluency and Oral Reading Fluency. She continues to coach teachers using remote and on-site.

It was a very busy month with the 3rd quarter ending on 3/24/22.

## Math Plan Focus

For the month of March, Mary Buck returned to support implementation of Eureka Math. Walkthroughs through 2nd grade classrooms showed students solving addition and subtraction problems by making a 10, in Module 1. Walkthroughs through 3rd grade classrooms had students multiplying in lessons for Module 3. Grade level meetings with the IC included: 1) Implementing I Do/You Do in order for students to become independent while solving problems; 2) The importance of being able to compose/decompose numbers; 3) Less teacher talk and more student talk; 4) The need to have students verbalize important concepts being taught – ie. Anytime 1 is added to a number, it is the next number; 5) Implementing the Flashcard Fluency Activity 6) The importance of having students be at their grade level fluency proficiency by the end of 2nd grade and 3rd grade. Mary modeled the flashcard fluency activity for addition/subtraction and
