Idaho Statewide Accountability System: An Overview of the Proposed Framework

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Background

- April 2010 The Accountability Oversight Committee was established as an ad-hoc committee of the State Board of Education
 - Makes recommendations to the Board on improvements to the statewide student achievement system
 - Reports annually to the Board on the effectiveness of the system
- December 10, 2015 President Obama signed the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) reauthorizing the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965
- Pursuant to ESSA, states must implement new accountability systems aligned to the law by the 2017-2018 school year

Timeline

- January 2016 The State Board of Education charged the Accountability Oversight Committee (AOC) with bringing forward recommendations to the Board for a new state accountability system
 - Alignment with the Governor's Task Force for Improving Education
 - Meet the federal accountability requirements
 - Include input from all education stakeholders
- January June 2016 AOC develops framework with input from stakeholder groups and an online survey
- 2016-2017 school year Test year for the recommended system
- 2017-2018 school year Full implementation as required by ESSA



Statewide Accountability System Guiding Principles

Develop an Accountability System that:

- Includes multiple measures which provide meaningful, trustworthy data and aid schools in building a culture of student achievement and school improvement
- Reports results responsibly to accurately depict student achievement
- Is flexible in application to school design and considers schools' unique situations



Performance Measures

- An accountability system that includes indicators which meet the federal and state accountability requirements
- Indicators to be provided on a data dashboard that present a well-rounded picture of school performance
- Separate indicators for 3 types of schools
 - Elementary and Middle Schools (K-8)
 - High Schools
 - Alternative High Schools
- Indicators <u>may</u> consist of indexes using multiple measures to exhibit performance



K-8 Indicators

- Academic Indicators
 - ISAT proficiency and growth
 - ISAT proficiency is a federal requirement for state accountability systems
 - Idaho Reading Indicator at-grade level/growth
 - English Learner achieving English language proficiency/growth
 - English Learner proficiency is a federal requirement for state accountability systems

School Quality Indicators

- **Note:** Per federal requirements, state accountability systems must include at least one School Quality Indicator
 - Next Level Readiness Index
 - Ex.: Measure of 5th graders ready for middle school
 - Ex.: Percent of 8th graders enrolled in Algebra I or higher
 - Chronic Absenteeism Index
 - Teacher Quality and Engagement Index
 - Ex.: Teachers with an advanced degree or National Board Certification
 - Ex.: Teacher attendance



High School Indicators

- Academic Indicators
 - ISAT proficiency
 - ISAT proficiency is a federal requirement for state accountability systems
 - English Learner achieving English language proficiency/growth
 - English Learner proficiency is a federal requirement for state accountability systems
 - Four-Year Cohort Graduation Rate
 - Adjust to include students that graduate in the summer of their Senior year
 - Graduation rate is a federal requirement for state accountability systems

School Quality Indicators

- **Note:** Per federal requirements, state accountability systems must include at least one School Quality Indicator
 - College and Career Readiness Index
 - Ex.: Measure of students taking Advanced Opportunities courses and credits earned
 - Ex.: College entrance exam performance
 - Chronic Absenteeism Index
 - Teacher Quality and Engagement Index



Alternative High School Indicators

- Academic Indicators
 - ISAT proficiency
 - ISAT proficiency is a federal requirement for state accountability systems
 - English Learner achieving English language proficiency/growth
 - English Learner proficiency is a federal requirement for state accountability systems
 - Four Year Cohort Graduation Rate
 - Graduation rate is a federal requirement for state accountability systems
 - Extended Year Graduation Rate
 - Based on a five-year cohort
- School Quality Indicators
 - <u>Note:</u> Per federal requirements, state accountability systems must include at least one School Quality Index
 - Credit Recovery/Accumulation Index
 - Chronic Absenteeism Index
 - Teacher Quality and Engagement Index
 - Student Engagement Index
 - Ex.: Classroom teacher to student ratio
 - Ex.: Counselor/college-career advisor to student ratio



Student Growth Calculations

- Academic growth is included as a proposed academic indicator among all school categories in this proposed framework
 - The State Department of Education is working closely with members of the Idaho Assessment Technical Advisory Committee to recommend a new model for calculating student growth
 - ISAT scores from 2015 and 2016 are being used to test different models

Scoring and Reporting

- Data regarding schools' performance on all accountability indicators will be presented publicly on an interactive online data dashboard
 - User friendly
 - School demographics/characteristics will be included to provide context
- All indicators broken-out by subgroups



Overall

- The draft accountability system, particularly the indicators designated for use for federal accountability, is compliant with ESSA requirements
- Public input is being gathered to assist identifying how to measure certain indicators
