Issue Summary:

Panorama Education and the Association of Alaska School Boards released the results of the North Slope Borough School District's 2024 School Climate and Connectedness Survey.

Background:

The School Climate and Connectedness Survey is a voluntary statewide survey that measures positive school climate, how connected students feel to adults and peers, social and emotional learning (SEL), and observed risk behaviors at school or school events. The American Institute for Research, in partnership with the Association of Alaska School Boards, developed the School Climate Connectedness Survey.

The North Slope Borough School District participated in the School Climate Connectedness Survey in 2008, 2010, and has participated every year since 2017. The data collected is used for school improvement and grant purposes.

The North Slope Borough School District saw a considerable increase in participation in the School Climate and Connectedness Survey in 2024. Participation in the Grade 3-5 survey saw a 91% increase from the previous year (2023 - 174 students, 2024 - 332 students). Participation in the Grade 6-12 survey saw a 52% increase of the prior year (2023 - 432 students, 2024 - 658 students).

This aligns with the board's direction and provides the District with data that more accurately represents our student population.





The 2024 School Climate and Connectedness Survey was administered in schools to students in grades 3-12 from January 22 through March 15, 2024. Families and Staff were also asked to participate in their survey.

Documents behind this memo include the 2024 School Climate and Connectedness Survey results.

Results:


2024 Grade 6-12 Students - 658 responses - an increase from 432 responses in 2023

In grades 6-12, students are asked questions about drug and alcohol use, delinquent behavior, family and community involvement, social and emotional learning, cultural connectedness, community support, high expectations, caring adults, school safety, student involvement, respectful climate, and peer climate.


Many areas addressed through the 6-12 survey saw only minor changes in responses gathered from 2023. The most significant areas addressed through the 6-12 survey are listed below.

When asked about perceptions of their closeness to adults in the school, 60 % responded favorably, a 4% increase from 2023. While 60% still indicates room for growth, the positive trend over the past two years aligns with the Board's priority and implementing the NSBSD Pedagogy.

The higher the percentage, the better, reflecting more favorable perceptions of caring adults.



The questions with the most significant change from 2023 about caring adults are below:









When asked how often they had observed students engaging in delinquent behavior at school in the last 12 months, 80 % responded favorably, a 4% increase from 2023.

The higher the percentage, the better, as it reflects more instances of "0 times" in which the behavior was observed.



The questions with the most significant change from 2023 about delinquent behaviors are below:



2024 Staff Survey - 189 responses - an increase from 131 responses in 2023





Staff is asked questions about drug and alcohol use, staff beliefs, delinquent behavior, student-to-staff relationships, school safety, cultural connectedness, staff-to-staff relationships, trauma-engaged schools, school leadership and involvement, family/school partnerships, student involvement, district leadership, social-emotional learning, and student-to-student relationships.

The most significant areas addressed through the staff survey are listed below.

When asked questions related to staff-to-student relationships, 68% responded favorably, a 9% increase from 2023. The increase from 2023 to 2024 aligns with the board's direction, NSBSD Pedagogy, and this administration's emphasis on building connections and maintaining relationships with our students. Parent and Family Engagement was a centerpiece of the district's work last year.



The questions with the most significant change from 2023 about caring adults are below:



When asked questions related to staff-to-staff relationships, 62 % responded favorably, a 7% increase from 2023.


How have results changed over time?








When asked questions related to family/school partnership, 57 % responded favorably, an 8% increase from 2023.

2024 Family Survey - 101 responses - an increase from 75 responses in 2023

Families are asked questions about student support at home, family/school partnerships, school safety, and cultural connectedness.


All areas showed positive change except for the families' capacity for family/school partnerships, which decreased by 2% from 2023

The most significant areas addressed through the staff survey are listed below.

When asked questions related to families' perception of how supportive they are of their child's education, 83 % responded favorably, a 3% increase from 2023.



The questions with the most significant change from 2023 about families' perception of how supportive they are of their child's education are below:





When asked questions about the schools' capacity for family/school partnership, 65 % responded favorably, a 12% increase from 2023. The data below reflects this administration's commitment to rebuilding, repairing, and revitalizing the school district and community relationship, reflected in the NSBSD Pedagogy. If we continue to increase this area by 10% each year, we can expect a score of at least 80% in 2 years.

The questions with the most significant change from 2023 in relation to schools' capacity for family/school partnership are below:


2024 Grade 3-5 Students - 332 responses - an increase from 174 responses in 2023

In grades 3-5, students are asked about safety, social and emotional learning, and caring for others.


Our students in grades 3-5 responded less favorably to school safety, social and emotional learning, and caring for others than students in other K-12 schools, elementary schools, rural schools, and participating Alaska District.

When asked if they feel safe at school, 58% responded favorably. This is an 8% drop from 2023

As a District, we realize that this area needs extra support. In response, this year, the district added a position for a district-wide Social-Emotional Coordinator serving all schools and an SEL counselor specifically for Ipalook since their enrollment is so large. We will monitor this throughout the school year and expect to see an increase when the SCCS is administered again in the spring.




When asked how often they use SEL skills in self-awareness, social awareness, self-management, relationship skills, and good decision-making, 55% responded favorably. This is a 7% decrease from 2023.






The questions with the most significant change from 2023 in relation to Social and Emotional Learning are below:



When asked about the level of caring and support students receive from peers, staff, and community members at school, 53 % responded favorably. This is a 10% decrease from 2023.
