BOARD POLICY

To assure that an teacher employee is not placed in a conflict of interest position with regard to assisting pupils, payment or gifts may not be accepted for tutoring or for providing private lessons (during or after school hours) to those pupils taught by the teacher employee during the regular school day

An A teacher employee may tutor or provide private lessons to pupils or athletes whom they do not teach or coach after the regular instructional day. Such instruction should take place off school premises and after the school day is completed.

The Board authorizes the superintendent to establish administrative procedures consistent with this policy.

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURE

- 1. Tutoring through the use of grants/awards received by the district
- 1.1. The District desires to provide additional opportunities for increased learning to benefit its students.
- 1.2. From time to time, grants may be awarded to the District that involve the hiring of teachers to provide learning opportunities for students after school hours. Grants/awards may be directed at such things as assisting homeless children, improving student performance on achievement tests, closing the achievement gap, etc.
- 1.3. Teachers who are offering their services and are paid through these funds may tutor their own students.
- 1.4. The employment by the District of teachers pursuant to such grants/awards does not constitute violation of this policy.
