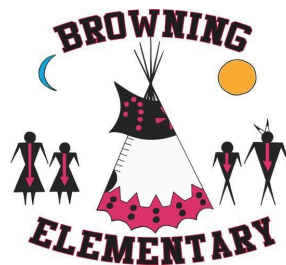

Instructional Coaches Report

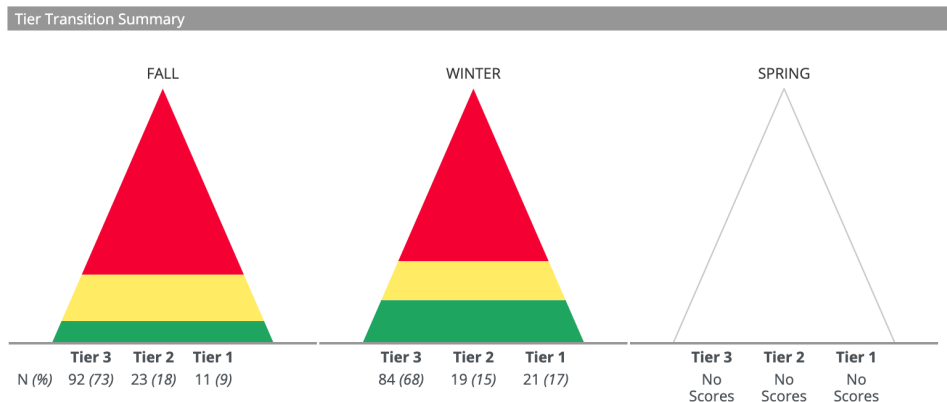

Our teachers worked diligently with mid year benchmark testing in ELA and Math to ensure all students completed testing. Following the benchmark assessment we were able to support teaching staff in PD's of goal setting for individual students, classroom and instruction.

In the busy month of Jan. we supported teachers with progress monitoring, benchmark assessment, MAST testing preparation. Once the collection of assessment data was completed we were able to share with the teachers through data meetings how to reflect on the data and plan for next steps through goal setting.

Below is our Aimsweb Winter Benchmark Tier Report for Reading. The second grade data shows 73% for tier 3 in the Fall and this has been reduced by 5% to 68%. Tier 2 decreased as well. In the Fall 18% were at tier 2 and it decreased to 15%. Tier 1 shows the most gains. In the Fall 9% of students tested as proficient and now it has increased to 17%. A gain of 8%.. Second grade is on their way to reaching their May goal of increasing tier 1 to 25% and decreasing tier 3 to 37%.

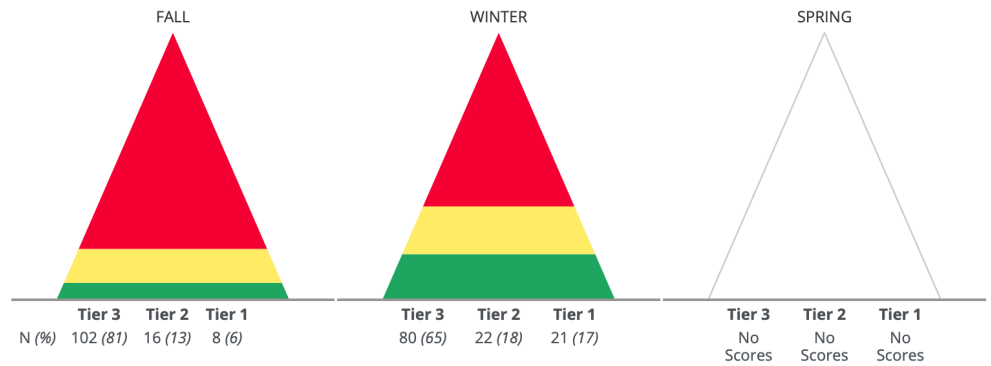


Below is the second grade Tier Report for Math. In the Fall tier 3 had 81% and this has been reduced significantly to 65%, which is a 16% decrease. Tier 1 in the Fall was 6% proficient. The current Winter Benchmark for tier 1 is 17%. This is an 11% increase. Our 2nd grade teachers are working hard to increase tier 1 and decrease tier 3.

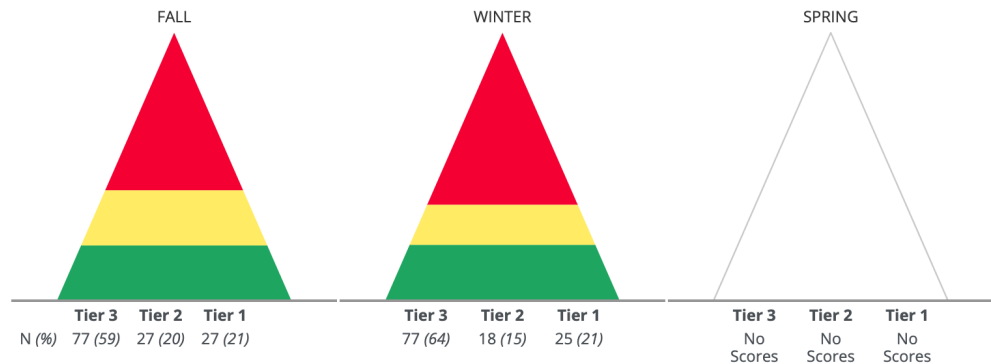

Tier Transition Summary



Below is our Aimsweb Winter Benchmark Tier Report for Reading. The third grade data shows 59% for tier 3 in the Fall and this has increased by 5% to 64%. Tier 2 decreased.. In the Fall 20% were at tier 2 and it decreased to 15%. Tier 1 shows no growth.. In the Fall 21% of students tested as proficient and remained at 21%. The May benchmark for tier 1 is 34% and for tier 3 the goal is to decrease to 29%

Tier Transition Summary



Below is the third grade Tier Report for Math. In the Fall tier 3 had 78% and this has decreased to 76%, which is a 2% decrease. Tier 1 in the Fall was 10% proficient. The current Winter Benchmark for tier 1 is 12%. This is a 2% increase. Our 3rd grade teachers are working hard to decrease tier 3 and increase tier 1.
