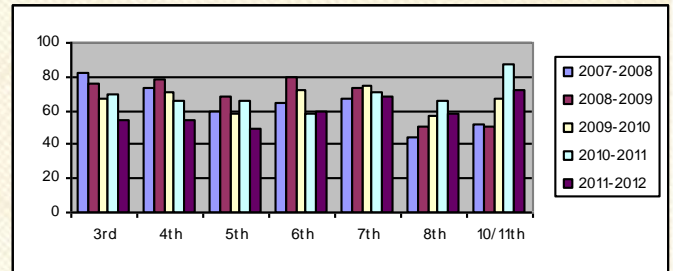

Assessment Test Results

Students in grades 3rd through 8th and 10th grade are tested in reading and math each year to determine progress toward state benchmarks. These tests measure the “things a student should know” by a grade level. The graphs below show how Sheridan School District students have done over the last five years. It is important to note that state tests are a one-time snapshot used to assess how students are doing. State tests are used along with other assessment data to track student progress. The Oregon Department of Education utilizes the state test to determine how successful a school district is in relationship to state totals.

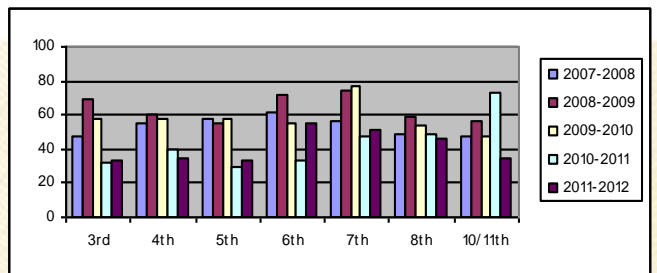
