Title IA/Parental and Family Involvement

The Board recognizes that parent<u>al and family</u> involvement is vital to achieve maximum educational growth for students participating in the district's Title I<u>A</u> program. Therefore, in compliance with federal law and <u>the</u> Oregon Department of Education guidelines, the district shall meet with parents <u>and family</u> to provide information regarding their school's participation in the Title IA program and its requirements.

The superintendent shall ensure equivalence among participating schools in teachers, administration and other staff, and in the provisions of curriculum materials and instructional supplies.

The Board directs the superintendent to ensure that each of the district's schools participating in the Title IA program meets annually. Parents and family of participating students shall be informed of their right to be involved in the development of the district's parental involvement and family engagement policy, overall district Title IA plan and school-parent compacts.

The district shall, to the extent practicable, provide full opportunities for the participation of parents with limited English proficiency, parents with disabilities and parents of migratory students, including providing information and school reports in a language such parents understand.

In cooperation with parents **and family**, the district's policy, plan and compact shall be reviewed annually and updated periodically to meet the changing needs of parents and the schools, and distributed to parents of participating students in an understandable and uniform format and, to the extent practicable, in a language the parents can understand.

The superintendent shall develop administrative regulations as necessary to implement this policy and meet the requirements of law.
