

SUMMATIVE DESIGNATION

Below you will find slides that explain our summative designation of Commendable this year. You will see that the majority of the score comes from IAR. Half of the points come from Growth in Math and Reading, and 15% of the points come from proficiency in Math and Reading. While it is the 3-5 grade teachers that administer the test, it is the responsibility of us all to do all we can to ensure that Gary School is earning the highest possible score in the designation area. Primary grades should be looking at the practice problems so that you are informed as to where your current students are expected to be working once they enter 3rd grade. Continue to push hard to

Exemplary	Schools performing in the top 10 percent of schools statewide, with no underperforming student groups .
Commendable	A school that has no underperforming student groups , a graduation rate greater than 67 percent, and whose performance is not in the top 10 percent of schools statewide.
Targeted	A school in which one or more student groups performing at or below the level of the "all students" group in the lowest performing 5 percent of schools.
Comprehensive	A school that is in the lowest-performing 5 percent of schools in Illinois and any high school with a graduation rate of 67 percent or less.

ensure that they have the background knowledge and building blocks that they will need to be successful when they leave the primary section of the school. Something that all of us can work on is attendance. After IAR, attendance is the next area where we can earn a good amount of points. In order to receive credit for attendance for a child, they need to have been in school for at least 91% of the school days. Today marked the 96th day of school. That means that any child that has missed 10 days as of today is considered chronically absent.


