#### Principal's Corner


As the month of January draws to a close and in light of current events from around our nation with school shootings and such, I thought it would be fitting to give parents an update on school safety at Hidden Valley High School. School safety is priority #1 here at HVHS. As the new Principal, I can say with certainty, that our safety plans and proactive approach to keeping your children safe has been intentional and proactively planned.

From the start of the year, we have implemented the PBIS (Positive Behavior Intervention System) program like never before seen here at HVHS. This program teaches across all classrooms appropriate behaviors that begin with being respectful, responsible, and safe. Traditionally, this program has been used in our elementary schools, and only used sparingly in high schools until recently. At HVHS, PBIS encompasses norms that should be evident in all of our high school aged youth. These norms are recognized by a system wide approach. Topics range in detail of how to properly walk down a crowded hallway to such things as bullying and/or harassment. The PBIS picture creates a cultural shift in our building to one that is tolerant for what is good and intolerant for what is not wanted or appreciated by all students and staff regardless of who they are. Early signs show that PBIS implementation is having a positive impact. Our office referrals are way down from a year ago- in some instances nearly 30%.

All of our safety plans have been reviewed by a safety committee and local law enforcement personnel. We have created a new and updated clipboard management system with all safety protocols for every classroom in our high school. In addition to this upgrade, we have made some adjustments with tracking visitors and the management of our physical plant. All outside doors are locked during the day with exception to the main entry and one other that allows students access to separate facilities on campus. Staff and visitors are required to wear an identification badge and we are exploring cost effective measures to improve safety- such as, shutting the fire doors without setting the alarm off in the case of a lockdown. As this spring moves forward, look for another joint lockdown training session coupled with our local police.

It is our schools purpose to be diligent with school safety so we can educate and promote student learning through programs where academic and behavioral growth is at the forefront of creating a school environment that is conducive with a safe place for all. Please feel free to contact me or stop by so we can visit about any of our protocols or programs here at HVHS. We are well on our path to a great spring, and I plan on keeping the community abreast of what is happening at Hidden Valley High School when it comes to school and student safety.

It has been around since 1969, and allows us to compare student progress over time.

# Why is NAEP important?

## What subjects will NAEP assess?

Students will be assessed in mathematics or reading. Students will only participate in one subject, and it will take approximately 90 minutes.

#### Who will take NAEP?

NAEP 2013 will be administered to a nation-wide sample of students, including 49 students here at Hidden Valley High School.
