High School Students have currently received audition material and are working on their auditions which will be early December. We are doing a play called *Blood Wedding*, and the students are already invested in it and very interested.

We have currently been rehearsing a couple weeks, and the play is going great so far. I have a great group of students who are really bringing this play to life. ~Competition will be Saturday, December 14 at Princeton High School.

Math- Marissa Cabrales

In Algebra 1 we are wrapping up our Writing Linear Equations Unit and will soon be moving on to the Solving Systems of Equations. We are continuing to use the TI Navigator System that was purchased through grant money this summer and it is assisting in class participation and in allowing the class to see its growth.

Tracie Zatopek Algebra I & Algebra III Teacher

We are working on congruent triangles in **geometry** and will soon be moving on to relationships within triangles.

We have finished the chapter on differentiation in **AP Calculus** and are about to begin applications of derivatives.

Greg Lortz

Some of the students in the Pre-Calculus classes will be helping Mrs. Zatopek with tutoring some of the Algebra 1 students. This is a great opportunity for community service. In class, Pre-Calculus is studying principle and interest with exponential growth and decay.

Algebra 2 finished their Unit on Systems and are now using technology to help solve systems with matrices.

Science- Penny Wimbrough

Physics: We just finished our unit on projectiles and trajectory. The students worked very hard to learn how to predict the trajectory of items launched from different heights and speeds. The 'on-level' students did a lab to calculate the initial horizontal velocity of a toy car that moved down a ramp and then launched out over a table. The PAP's did a lab where they found the initial vertical velocity of a rocket that we launched outside the school. We are finishing our unit on gravity, how it was discovered, it's nature and calculations. This involved its effect on satellites, ocean tides, finding new planets, black holes and more.

Pre-AP physics: The students just completed a 'problem-based' learning activity in which they assumed the role of insurance agents. From clues they were given about a car accident, they had to decide who was at fault using kinematic equations.

Biology: We just finished our unit on energy. They were studying photosynthesis and cellular respiration.

Pre-AP Biology: They are completing their photosynthesis unit. During this unit they separated the pigments in a spinach leaf. Next they will be beginning a unit on cellular respiration.

AP Biology: They are working on an inquiry lab in which they will determine the sugar concentration in various fruits and vegetables. They have also completed a blast lab where they compared the gene of a protein across various organisms to see if it was conserved. Next they are going on to macro molecules where they will look at the structures of various proteins, lipids and carbohydrates.

Medical Microbiology: They are finishing up their bacteriology unit. They are looking at epidemiology and investigating various state and federal agencies as to their function and job opportunities. They are also working on identifying the bacteria that they isolated from the school environment.

Environmental Science: The students are studying the different levels of ecological organization. They are working in groups to design a poster that accurately describes the characteristics of different biomes.

Biology: Students are working to understand the different types of macromolecules using paper organic molecule models.

Chemistry: The chemistry group is currently learning chemical bonding, covering periodic trend, electron configuration and bonding. The students have just completed a chemical bonding lab where they observed the properties of ionic, covalent and metallic bonds.

Pre-AP Chemistry: The Pre-AP chemistry group is currently studying chemical bonding, covering periodic trend, electron configuration and bonding. The students have just completed a chemical bonding lab where they identified ionic, covalent and metallic bonds based on observed properties such as conductivity and solubility.

Spanish Club – Brandee Gallagher

The Aubrey High School Spanish Club is gaining popularity all the time. We just had our "Día de los Muertos" October meeting to celebrate and learn about the "Day of the Dead". At the meeting, we watched a short film and then did a craft. Mr. Muñiz, our new AHS Spanish Teacher, brought some "pan de muerto," a traditional sweet bread served at this time of year, for the students to try. It was a big hit!

Our next meeting will be our Christmas Potluck and gift exchange. We will have sign ups beginning after Thanksgiving. Last year we had about 20 in attendance, and students are already asking about it for this year. Each student will sign up to bring a dish and to participate, if they choose, in the gift exchange. We are looking forward to this event.

AHS student, Daisy Granados, has really taken a lead with Spanish Club, and is organizing the gift exchange. She has also designed a t-shirt that students will have the chance to order at the December meeting.
