

The fourth annual Sources of Strength Suicide prevention booster training event at HHS was Wednesday September 26th. Mrs. Debbie Flaming a state certified trainer for Sources of Strength through the S.P.A.N. Idaho (Suicide Prevention Action Network) conducted the training. Homedale High School students were nominated by fellow students, teachers and staff to participate in the program. Sources of Strength is a wellness program that connects students to resources that can help them and the peers they influence when they are going through tough times. A theme of Sources of Strength is to break codes of silence that young people may find themselves in and to help them establish relationships with trusted adults. One of the outcomes of the training is that students and the advisors work together to plan



campaigns to spread messages of Hope, Help & Strength throughout the school and community. Adult Advisers for the new school year are Mr. Lee, Miss Renner, Mr. Grove, Mrs. Thatcher, Mrs. Haylett, and Mrs. Forsberg.




Wednesday, October 10th, End of 1st Quarter

ACT Test for Senior's: Fall 2018 ACT for Juniors Spring 2019



September 28th was the registration deadline for the **October 27th ACT**. Seniors registered for the test during Senior Leadership and Economics classes. Fee Waivers are available for the cost of the test. The test will be proctored at Homedale High School. The next ACT test is December 8th. The registration deadline for the test is November 2nd.On test day arrival time is between 7:30 & 7:45 a.m. Students are to bring two #2 pencils, an approved calculator, a photo

ID. ACT test prep has been planned during advisory classes. Student may begin preparing for the ACT by logging into their march 2 success account at http://march2success.com.
