


25-26 Calendar Planning Update

October 2024



School Districts with Four-Day Weeks

As of Oct. 4, 2024

108 school districts across
Texas have now switched to a
four-day school week, while at
least 21 other districts offer a
hybrid schedule, with four-day
weeks for part of the year.

Planning Ahead

- 2023-24 Calendar was 40% 4-Day
- 2024-25 Calendar is a "hybrid" calendar with 51% 4-Day weeks
- Began transition in 2024-25 with the adjustment of start times.
- FAQ (work in progress) for parents & staff based on survey results and common feedback

2025-2026 Draft Calendar

- Adjustments made in consideration of survey and presentation feedback and DEIC meetings
- Number of Staff Days: 165
- August will have three full weeks to meet required minutes without extending the day further
- 4-Day week would begin in September and remains consistent throughout the year

- No early release days
- Move to 9 week grading periods
- 630 extra minutes built in (1 day)
- 2 scheduled bad weather makeup days in April
- Drafts are still being developed by DEIC. Changes may be necessary.

Teaching & Learning

Curriculum & Instruction

- During summer PD (May & June), discussions began with teachers on planning for adjustment in scope & sequence and will continue throughout the school year.
- The 2024-25 calendar has many 4-day weeks built in to it, teachers are adjusting to a 4-day instructional weeks within the 24-25 school year.
- For subject areas that utilize TÉKS Resource System, the updated platform was shown at August PD with a new interactive calendar function that adjusts scope and sequence based on instructional minutes in addition to the scope based on number of days.
- Currently coordinating with HMH (ELAR curriculum) for an on-site planning session with teachers and literacy facilitator to make any adjustments needed to accommodate this year's 4 day week. HMH also stated that they have schools on a 4-day week who are very successfully utilizing their curriculum.

Assessment

- The reduction in the number of school days will impact instructional days. Therefore, district assessments and calendars have and will continue to be evaluated for effectiveness to determine the most effective use of instructional time.
 - CBAs were changed from 6 to 9 weeks.
 - Removed November interim testing.



Teaching & Learning

CTE

- CTE funding is not negatively impacted.
- Currently working with Region 11 regarding 4 day weeks as it relates to CTE.

GT

- Implemented an updated schedule in 2024-25 to make any adjustments as needed.
- The adjusted schedule allows for a week of testing 1st-5th graders, and a week of testing kindergarteners without decreasing the required amount of minutes.
- The adjusted schedule has allotted time to preemptively schedule annual formal meetings with the admin committee during set times



Special Education

- 2024-2025 annual ARDs will be written to reflect a schedule of services for the 4-day work week in 2024-2025 and 2025-2026.
- The speech department is currently transitioning to a 3:1 service delivery model: with minutes provided 3 out 4 weeks a month, the 4th week is an indirect week for classroom observation, teacher collaboration, etc.- this model is considered best practice.



Child Nutrition

Feeding Wise Kids

A big concern is our at-risk population not being fed on Fridays. We would continue to partner with the organization **Feeding Wise Kids - Backpack Buddies** to provide a meal for students who are on free/reduced lunch to take home on Thursdays. This would ensure all students who need a meal, receive a meal.

Maintenance & Operations

Considerations:

Transportation

- Guaranteed 6.25 hours for 4 days
- No change in overtime eligibility

Custodial

4- 10 hour days with 1 or 2 5th day floaters

Maintenance

- Normal 5 day work week
- Reduced overtime
- Flexibility for urgent repairs
- Preventive maintenance
- Better productivity

Maintenance & Operations

Potential savings

- Fuel savings
- Operational costs
- Extended life of building and equipment



Finance/HR

- Add new duty calendars and tie each employee to the correct calendar for the 4-day calendar.
- Add new work schedules for all non-exempt staff and make adjustments to comp time for the 4-day calendar.
- District will work with TASB on revisions to the compensation plan (no decrease in total compensation for employees). Daily rates will be adjusted to the new number of days worked for exempt employees.
- Substitute hourly rate would change from 90.00 to 102.00 to reflect the additional time worked per day.
- The number of substitutes used monthly would be reviewed and evaluated for any possible changes in the future.
- Year of serviceable credit through TRS would take longer into the year to achieve (ie. the 90th day would happen deeper into the second semester)
 - o In TRS we will be a non-standard work week employer. This means retirement will not be an option at semester because 90 days would not have been reached for employees to get a year of service credit.
