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Give a brief narrative description of the requested waiver. Waskom ISD is seeking a waiver of 8 instructional days to implement an Optional Flexible Year Program (OFYP) that will target students at risk of not being promoted to the next grade level, failing courses and/or not meeting standards on Texas state assessments.
2. Does the district or campus plan reflect the need for this waiver? If yes, what is the specific objective impacted by the waiver? Yes, the district improvement plan reflects the need for this waiver. The specific objective impacted by the waiver is Goal 1 Objective 1: By the spring of 2013, all student groups will meet or exceed the reading, writing, math, science and social studies state averages on state administered assessments. All students and student groups will achieve satisfactory performance on state measures.
3. Cite the Texas Education Code or the Texas Administration Code that the district or campus wishes to waive? In accordance with Texas Education Code (TEC) 29.0821, a school district may modify their instructional calendar to provide a flexible year program to meet the educational needs of its students, including providing intensive instructional services. A school district approved by the commissioner of education to implement an Optional Flexible Year Program (OFYP) may reduce the number of instructional days for certain students.
4. Describe the plan to be implemented, if the waiver is granted. The Waskom ISD Board of Trustees approved the instructional calendar on February 13, 2012. This calendar included the proposed modification of releasing eligible students for 8 days (Nov. 15-16, 2012; Jan. 3-4, 2013; April 18-19, 2013; and May 9-10, 2013). The instructional calendar includes 180 days of instruction for students who fall into the at-risk category of failing to promote to the next grade level or of not meeting standards on a Texas state administered test. The waived instructional days for students not at-risk will provide teachers an opportunity to target the the smaller number of students who are at risk and need intervention.
5. How will granting this waiver help achieve the district's or campus' objective? The waived instructional days for students not at-risk will provide teachers an opportunity to target the smaller number of students who are at risk and need intervention. All teachers on participating campuses will provide instruction which will result in an estimated teacher-student ratio of 1 teacher for every 6 students. The focus of the instruction will be in the core subjects and based on each student's need.
6. Please explain how the school district or campus will evaluate the impact of the waiver towards meeting the district's or campus goal. Student progress will be monitored through diagnostic testing and benchmark test data. The student performance on the 2013 state administered tests will provide data for a summative evaluation.
