1. What's new at CIHS?

- i. From PBIS: The grade levels with the least number of Behavior Reports (B.R.) for this past month were: 11th grade (11 B.R.)—(3rd month won!), 9th grade (3 B.R.)—(3rd month won) and the 7th grade (10 B.R.)—(3rd month won!). The students in these grades will receive a special treat this month as well as the Ranger Way "You're A Class Act" banner being hung in their locker bay! The "treat or reward" gets bigger the more times a class wins the monthly contest each semester. In Grades 7-12, there were 62 B.R. for the month.
