RE: Safe Schools Status Report

The Mades-Johnstone Center (MJC) has housed the Kane County Regional Office of Education Safe Schools Program since the 2013-2014 school year. Attached is the current status of Safe School enrollment as well as a five-year trend data. Currently, 10 students are participating in the program with the following district utilization: Central 301 (2); Kaneland 302 (1); St. Charles 303 (3); and Geneva 304 (2).

Student "success" for the Safe Schools program is defined as a student who completed the program without behavioral incident that would warrant the fulfillment of expulsion by the school district. A five-year trend indicates student success as: 2013-2014:75%; 2014-2015: 72% and 2015-2016: 67%. In May, 2016 the Board agreed to changes in programming that included positive interventions and adjustment to the exclusionary criteria as a result of the passage of SB100, significantly altering the parameters of school districts' discipline policies. Subsequently, student success rate was increased to 100% for both school years of 2016-2017 and 2017-2018.



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


## Overview of the Last 9 years

### Additional Information

2016-2017

- SB100
- D101 notifies MVSEC of discontinuing use of Safe Schools Program
- Student enrollment decreased and in response a Teaching Assistant position is eliminated

Trends in last 2 years

- BOE decisions are less lengthy (majority are 1 or 2 semesters) overall
- BOE decisions may include interventions or varied timelines based on student performance

2017-2018

- Students enrollment similar to previous year for 1 semester
- Continue programming with 1 Certified Teacher
