School News:

Several teachers have had opportunies to attend conferences in the last month to help support teaching and learning at Evergreen. On February 20, Mrs. Queener, Mrs. Gragg, and Mrs. Hults attended Classroom Management Strategies that Work in Medford with Erica LeBleu, Kelli Palmerton, and myself. Erica and Kelli are the district mentors for these teachers and sent these beginning teachers to put some more tools in their toolbox. After the seminar, each teacher spoke of take-aways from this conference that they would like to try in their classroom during the rest of the year.

Our kindergarten team and I attended the Full-Day Kindergarten Implementation and Planning Conference in Eugene last Thursday and Friday. Some of the break-out sessions we participated in were Family Engagement and School Collaboration: A Model to Maximize Student Attendance, Considerations for Implementing Full-Day Kindergarten, ,Closing the "30million Word Gap" through Full-Day Kindergarten, and Strong Foundations: Essential Components of a Full-Day Kindergarten Program are just a sessions that we were able to attend. We have come back with some thoughts and ideas how to help support the transition from half-day to full-day Kindergarten.

When I take or send teachers to conferences, I expect them to come back and share their findings with other staff during a professional development time on Fridays. This allows teachers to train teachers, which builds leaders in our building through sharing ideas to help support teaching and learning. Our goal is to continue to develop as a professional to help all students succeed at school and in life.
