Background Information:

Navarro ISD recognizes the value of community engagement and the benefits of offering distribution of extra-curricular opportunities to our students and families. However, to ensure the safety, well-being, and focus of our students to have quality opportunities outside of school, we propose a policy update that limits the distribution of non-school literature to non-profit organizations and credible youth-oriented services that meet specific criteria.

Rationale:

- 1. Student Focus: By restricting distribution to non-profit organizations and credible youth-oriented services, we prioritize student success and well-being through community engagement opportunities.
- 2. Partnership Credibility: Non-profit organizations often have a proven track record of providing valuable services to the community. This vetting process helps to ensure that the information being distributed is accurate, relevant, and mutually beneficial to the organization and district.
- 3. Insurance and Liability: Non-profit organizations hosting events and activities carry insurance which provides an additional layer of protection for our students and families. This helps to mitigate potential risks associated with off-campus activities or events promoted through non-school literature.
- 4. Resource Management: Limiting distribution to non-profit organizations helps to streamline the process and ensure that resources are allocated efficiently.

By implementing this policy, Navarro ISD aims to balance the benefit of community partnerships with the primary focus of providing credible opportunities to our students.
