Notification of school delays or cancellation: Brrrrr!! Winter has certainly started with a bang in Oregon!!! Parents, as we have already experienced weather related school delays, a school closure and activity cancellations or rescheduling, it is very important parents' most current contact information is on file—both preferred phone contact information and, if you have internet, your e-mail address. Anytime there is a delay or closure, that information will be provided to the local Portland television stations and KTIL radio station, posted on the district's website (www.nknsd.org) and the district's Facebook page. SchoolMessenger will be activated, providing an automated call notifying you of any changes. Occasionally, an e-mail announcement will be activated from the schools if there is a change or special announcement during the school day. Parents can also signup for FlashAlert which will automatically send out text messages and/or e-mail messages. To signup for FlashAlert, please visit the district website; select the Parents tab; click on School Closure and then select FlashAlert Signup. If you have questions about any of these notification options, please contact the high school office at 503-355-2272.

Free or Reduce Lunch Program: If your son and/or daughter was on the free or reduced lunch program last school year, did you complete an application to renew the program for the current school year? Has there been a change in employment resulted in a reduction of family income (i.e. work hours reduced)? "Neah-Kah-Nie School District encourages families to complete a National School Lunch Program Free of Reduced Meal application if they believe they meet the income guidelines". An application may be submitted by going to www.mymealtime.com or by visiting the district's website. On the Parents tab you will find a section on Food Service. Near the mid-section of this page you will access to the Mealtime Login, a downloadable paper application and current breakfast and lunch menus. You may also signup in the school office.

If you have any questions pertaining to your child's symptoms, you should contact your family medical provider or the health department.

Please consider joining the new ASPIRE (Access to Student assistance Programs In Reach of Everyone) Team here at Neah-Kah-Nie as a mentor volunteer. Volunteer ASPIRE mentors are assigned to work one-on-one with students, guiding them through important steps toward postsecondary education. The ASPIRE mentor position attracts a broad spectrum of adult volunteers. Many are parents/guardians of students at the ASPIRE school, professionals, some of whom are the first in their family to attend college, or retired community members. Volunteers do not have to have attended college themselves to be effective ASPIRE mentors. ASPIRE is for all students. It is an all-comer's program and serves the entire student body. Any student who believes they can benefit from an ASPIRE mentor is welcomed and encouraged to participate. By being inclusive, ASPIRE ensures that all of Oregon's students have many options for a fulfilling future beyond high school.

We are happy to report we have had a positive response from students about the ASPIRE program with 34 students currently signed up. With almost half of the student matched with mentors, we are still looking for more individuals that would be interested in getting involved with this program and our students.
