# **SSAISD TSI Support**

#### **TSI Tutorial Plan**

- TSI tutorial will be conducted through online software-PLATO.
- Staff will be available after school hours to assist students as the need arises.
- 8th grade students will have opportunity to test in the spring.

### **TSI Testing Plan**

- On campus TSI Testing will be administered weekly through April of 2021.
- Students who have completed a minimum of three module within a given content area will be allowed to test.

### **SSAISD TSI Support**

- Tutoring cohorts will be established and prioritized based on needs identified through TSI data.
- Students will access PLATO during their College Transition course including 9th grade students in the Early College Academy.
