August 6,2006 opening day of ASLA, one room + storage

Distinguished Unit Award: top 10% since inception

Aug 2009 uniform room added for final footprint: classroom, cadet management area, attic, backyard, Eagle patio

USAF contractual contributions to PUSD

One half of the instructors' Minimum Instructor Pay

- ~ \$80,000 of uniforms
- ~ \$20,000 books, equipment, rifles
- ~ \$8000 Stipend for travel, O&M per year





Intangible contributions & Cost avoidance

State Certified teachers teaching core credits

85 Free military computers, more in Computers for Learning Program

Additional 45 computers loaned to PHS by ASLA, goal is 100

Overt patriotism in PHS, uniforms: sir, ma'ams

Character Counts: increased visibility of respect and responsibility

>10,000 community service in 2008/9

PHS / PUSD advertisement: only JROTC of any kind in 95 mile radius 23 students came to PUSD for ASLA in 2009
