Overview

 In order to continue providing students with a wide variety of ACP experiences and learning environments, the high school is currently modifying the delivery model to provide access to students. This task is being facilitated by THS staff and our partners. Examples include: college tours and open houses, business/industry tours, classroom guest speakers and mock interviews. The same holds true for staff professional development delivery models with internal and external training opportunities.

It is important to also acknowledge the positive aspects of transitioning to a virtual environment and it is to be expected that the virtual environment will be used at some level in the future because of the benefits. Staff have been able to avoid the expenses and time associated with traveling to a workshop location. Students and staff have the flexibility to attend events at a time that works best for them especially if they are recorded for viewing. Workshops that traditionally had sessions occurring at the same time would force staff to pick between sessions. New formats allow a staff member to participate in all sessions. Depending on the event, a specific audience can be better identified to attend individual events versus a blanket "for all" approach that can be inefficient. The virtual environment can be an effective supplement to in person learning and education will benefit students and staff in the future.
