- 5 were certificate or occupational diploma students (at THS)
- 3 were HSAA students
- 1 was SDP student
- 3 were Ombudsman students
- 1 ELL student (at THS)
- 1 Deaf student (at THS)

Conclusions:

- Still not extending the writing skills of our advanced students
- Need to identify students in English II that may be at risk and start tutoring all year
- Need more focus on writing in all academic areas and grades throughout the district
