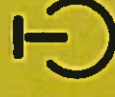

MLD 1:1 Update - November 2019

- Over 6,800 MLD's for Grades 8th and 9th have been disbursed to students
- A small number of students have opted to go BYOD and have not received a device as per parent request
- Campus 1:1 Team Administrators
 - Continue making personal calls to parents who opted out completely
 - Campus MLD Staff are making sure parents understand the academic benefits and the limitations when a child does not have access to a device.
- Librarians and/or other 1:1 Team Designees are working on students who have not yet returned their forms and on new arrivals
 - Phone Calls, Remind Notices and Emails
 - Campuses using CIT Videos for Parents/Students
 - Assist with explaining program and answering questions
